<p>In four to five sentences, describe the part of the book you enjoyed the most. What happened and why it was interesting.</p> <p>D</p>	<p>In four to five sentences, explain what the protagonist's greatest conflict was. Conflict is the problem in the story.</p> <p>E</p>	<p>In four to five sentences, describe the setting: location and time period. What was the story.</p> <p>F</p>
<p>In four to five sentences, explain what the antagonist at the end of the book. Be specific.</p> <p>G</p>	<p>In four to five sentences, describe the antagonist. Why is the antagonist important to the story? What conflict does this person cause for the protagonist?</p> <p>H</p>	<p>In four to five sentences, explain how the conflict is resolved. Give an example from the book.</p> <p>I</p>
